REGISTERED PUREBRED BREEDING ANIMALS

DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Flock numbers shall be used to identify all entries. An exhibitor may not use the same flock number on more than one animal during any two consecutive calendar years.
2. **REGISTRATION NUMBERS MAY NOT BE USED AS FLOCK NUMBERS.** Flock numbers and breeder's initials, name, or association prefix shall be on commercially used tags attached to the ear or tattooed in the ear for **YEARLINGS AND LAMBS BRED BY THE EXHIBITOR.**
3. **LAMBS MUST SHOW LAMBS TEETH.**
4. Lambs born from purchased bred ewe can bear the ear tag of the owner at the time of birth. They do not have to have original breeder's ear tag.
5. Tail dock length will be checked as designated in State Rules.
6. Breed classes may be split at the discretion of the Committee.
7. American System of Judging.
8. Exhibitors may enter two (2) entries per class.
9. Substitutions can only be made within a division. Substitutions must be made when the exhibit arrives at the fairgrounds, or for livestock, when registration certificates are checked. In the livestock department a minimum \$5 penalty must be paid prior to judging for each substitution made by the exhibitor in excess of two in the division. (State Rule # II-5)
10. All registered and unregistered entries must be verified prior to show day.
11. Any sheep that shows signs of fungus at any time during the fair (including Sunday) must be removed by the exhibitor immediately. The exhibitor is responsible for his/her animal(s) until tack-out on Sunday, September 19, 2010.
12. Use BREEDING ANIMAL entry form. Entry fee \$2.00.

DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. A permanent ear tag is required.
2. Animals, which have been registered by a purebred breed association, cannot be entered in this division.

- 9 BEST PAIR: Any two ewes (any age) from those previously shown as individuals
- 10 GET OF SIRE: Any four ewes sired by same ram, bred by exhibitor.

DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Copy of Bill of Sale or statement of ownership must be submitted with entry form, and breeder name must be recorded on entry form. **The following information is required on Bill of Sale and must be present before animal is allowed to check in:**
 - Breeder's name and address**
 - Birth date of Animal**
 - Scrapie identification ear tag number:**
 - breeder's herd ID and animal number**
2. Exhibitors may show two (2) market lambs but only sell one (1), unless both are champions. The exhibitor must inform the livestock office, within one (1) hour after the completion of the sheep shows which animal (by ear tag number) that they will sell. If a helper is required because the lambs are in the same class, the helper must be from the same organization as the exhibitor.
3. Although there is no maximum weight, auction payment will be adjusted to the 145 pounds maximum sale weight.
4. **MARKET ANIMALS** must arrive clean and dry and must have been shorn within one (1) week of the Fair. Infraction of these rules will result in animal not being weighed.
5. **NO FORCE FEEDING OR WATERING.**
6. **NO ARTIFICIAL COLORING** of fleece or body of animal will be allowed. Hooves and horns may be polished or blackened. Infraction of this rule will result in disqualification.
7. **Lambs exhibiting the callipygian genetic trait will be disqualified.**
8. Tail dock length will be checked as designated in State Rules.
9. All breeds judged together.
10. Danish System of Judging.
11. Santa Clara County entries limited to 10 animals. See Market Animal Rule 7.
12. Lambs must show lambs teeth.
13. Any sheep that shows signs of fungus at any time during the fair (including Sunday) must be removed by the exhibitor immediately. The exhibitor is responsible for his/her animal(s) until load-out on Sunday, September 19, 2010.
14. **Animals in livestock classes must be properly cared for at all times.** See General Rule 12.
15. Use MARKET entry form. Entry fee \$5.00.

MARKET LAMB SCORECARD

GRADE

Market Ready

USDA Prime or Choice quality with 12th rib back fat range .16-.35, average or greater conformation and cutability.

Not Market Ready

Good or lower quality grade with 12th rib back fat range <.16 or >.35; under finished lambs grading USDA good or lower, below-average conformation or cutability

NOTE:

1. Fairs may allow for additional grouping systems within the Market Ready lambs for sale purposes.
2. All underweight animals may show in feeder class. Any lamb judged NOT Market Ready will not be sold in the Junior Livestock Auction.
3. The buyer will pay only the maximum qualifying weight; 145 pounds for lambs.
4. To select Champion and Reserve Champion for Auction purposes each weight lot will also be judged by the American System.

3. Exhibitor must own the ewe prior to breeding, select ram, lamb out ewe, and raise lamb to market weight. These lambs will be judged after the completion of the Market Show.
4. 4-H, FFA and Independent will be judged together.
5. Use MARKET entry form. No entry fee.

REGISTERED PUREBRED BREEDING ANIMALS

DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All animals must arrive in show condition.
2. All breeds must be from a registered Breed Association.
3. Sows, Junior Yearlings or older (farrowed January 1, 2009 to August 31, 2009) must have raised a litter of pigs or be in pig, to be eligible for entry.
4. Gilts entered in the market classes may not be entered in the breeding classes and vice versa.
5. Draw ear notching on entry form. Do not use number to identify notching.
6. American System of Judging.
7. Use BREEDING Animal Entry Form. Entry fee \$2.00.

1. By his signature as the owner or agent on any entry form, the exhibitor also certifies that the sire of each animal entered in the following classes for grade animals was either registered or purebred.
2. A permanent ear tag or tattoo number or ear notching is required and must be shown on entry form.
3. Animals, which have been registered by a purebred association, cannot be entered in this division.
4. American System of Judging.
5. Use BREEDING ANIMAL entry form. Entry fee \$2.00.
