DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Market animals must be groomed and bathed and arrive in show condition. No body clipping at the Fair.
2. **The following information is required on Bill of Sale and must be present with Entry Form before animal is allowed to check in:**
 - Breeder's name and address**
 - Birth date of Animal**
 - Scrapie identification ear tag number: breeder's herd ID and animal number**
3. **All market goats must have a scrapie tag – tattoos will not be accepted.**
4. **NO FORCE FEEDING OR WATERING.**
5. **NO ARTIFICIAL COLORING** of body of animal will be allowed. Hooves may be polished or blackened. Infraction of this rule will result in disqualification.
6. WETHERS and DOES, any breed or crossbred goat less than 12 months of age showing kid teeth. All breeds judged together. Goats must be disbudded or dehorned, no horns will be allowed.
7. **Market Goats must remain in assigned pens.**
8. **Market Goats will be sold by the pound at the Junior Livestock Auction.**
9. Danish System of Judging. To select Champion and Reserve Champion for Auction purposes each weight lot will also be judged by the American System.
10. Santa Clara County entries limited to 10 animals. See Market Animal Rule 7.
11. Any goat that shows signs of fungus at any time while on the fairgrounds must be removed by the exhibitor immediately. The exhibitor is responsible for his/her animal(s) until load-out on Sunday, September 19, 2010.
12. General Rule 12 applies to all market goats.
13. Use MARKET entry form. Entry fee \$5.00.

MARKET GOAT (CHEVON) SCORECARD

GRADE

Market Ready USDA Prime or Choice quality with 12th rib back fat range .08-.12 most desirable, .13-.22 back fat acceptable, average or greater conformation and cutability.

Not Market Ready Good or lower quality grade with 12th rib back fat range <.08 or >.22; under finished goats grading USDA good or lower; below average conformation or cutability

After weighing, market goats may be divided into weight lots for convenience in judging.

All underweight animals will show in feeder class. Underweight animals will not be sold in Junior Livestock Auction.

BRED AND FED MARKET GOAT

DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Class breakdown to be determined by number of animals entered.
2. Animal must be entered in market class.
3. Exhibitor must own the doe prior to breeding, select buck, kid out doe, and raise goat to market weight. These goats will be judged after the completion of the Market Show.
4. 4-H, FFA and Independent will be judged together.
5. Use MARKET entry form. No entry fee.

Entries in this department will be doe goats that are used to produce meat-quality kids. This will be mainly Boer and Boer cross does but could also include does of other meat breeds. Registered and unregistered does will show together.

DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Animals must be owned by exhibitor pursuant to State rules.
2. A permanent ear tag or tattoo number is required and must be shown on entry form.
3. Commercial doe animals must have either an official Scrapie tag or must be appropriately tattooed.
4. All does must be able to be led and handled in show ring.
5. Animal must be groomed and bathed and arrive in show condition.
6. Use BREEDING ANIMAL entry form. Entry fee \$2.00.

REGISTERED PUREBRED BREEDING ANIMALS

AREA: All 4-H Clubs, FFA Chapters and Independent exhibitors located in the State of California. Limited to the first 250 animals, (refer to Livestock Rules).

DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. This is an Official A.D.G.A. show and their rules shall govern provided they do not conflict with State Rules.
2. **ALL ANIMALS WILL BE CHECKED ON ARRIVAL AND BEFORE BEING PLACED IN ASSIGNED PENS.**
3. Any animal with abscesses in any condition or any other contagious disease **MUST BE REMOVED FROM THE FAIRGROUNDS IMMEDIATELY.**
4. Animals must be bathed, body clipped and in show condition.
5. Purebred animals must have a "Certificate of Registry" (Blue Border) issued by the American Dairy Goat Association to be eligible
6. Recorded Grade animals must have a "Certificate of Recordation" (Brown Border) issued by the American Dairy Goat Association to be eligible. Experimentals, Grades, Native on Appearance, and Native on Performance

animals may all be shown as long as they have a "Certificate of Recordation".

7. Nigerian Dwarf Goats registered with the Nigerian Dwarf Association must ALSO be registered with ADGA.
8. Original certificates with the name of the exhibitor printed as owner are required. Signed transfers are not acceptable. For does under 6 months of age, a stamped duplicate is acceptable **only** if faxed directly from ADGA to the Fair Office before the end of the check in time. The office FAX number is (831)761-5827. Certificates may not be faxed for older animals.
9. A permanent tattooed ID is required. Make sure the tattoo matches the registration papers for your animal before the fair.
10. The base date for computing the age of the animal is September 15, 2010.
11. American System of Judging.
12. Junior and Senior Doe shows are not separately sanctioned.
13. Use BREEDING Animal Entry Form. Entry fee \$2.00.

CLASS

- 9 DAM & DAUGHTER: Dam and her daughter, any age. One entry by same dam per exhibitor. Indicate registration number of Dam on entry form.
- 10 JUNIOR GET OF SIRE: Three does sired by same buck. Senior yearling not in milk, or younger. One entry by same buck per exhibitor. Indicate registration number of Sire on entry form. Bred by exhibitor.
- 11 GET OF SIRE: Three does sired by same buck, at least one to be a yearling or older in milk. One entry by same buck per exhibitor. Indicate registration number of Sire on entry form.
- 12 BEST THREE FEMALES entered by same exhibitor.

FFA CHAPTER AND 4-H CLUB GROUPS

DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Group of three (3) dairy goats, from the group of dairy goats previously shown as individuals.
2. Each group must be owned by members of one Chapter or Club, no more than two (2) animals may be owned by one exhibitor.

DAIRY GOAT YOUTH AWARD

Sponsored by the Central Coast Counties Dairy Goat Association

A Belt Buckle will be awarded to the 4-H or FFA member who best exemplifies the Dairy Goat Industry.

Complete the entry form provided in this book. Submit with your entries by the entry deadline along with a one-page essay describing yourself and your Dairy Goat Project. Limited to youth's 9-19 years of age. Award will be given to the youth that best represents Dairy Goats during the Santa Cruz County Fair. In order to be fair to all exhibitors, previous winners of this award are not eligible to compete. **A minimum score of 80 points will be required.**

100 points total as follows:

| 25 points | Possible for PUBLIC IMAGE as shown by proper preparation or grooming of animals, cleanliness of exhibitor; and proper condition and health of animals. |
| 25 points | Possible for CLEANLINESS as indicated by the Clean Stall (competition) score card. Includes cleanliness of animal and exhibitor. |
| 15 points* | Possible for KNOWLEDGE, as conveyed to the public. Winners will answer questions politely, present a positive view of dairy goats, and inform the public factually with information on breed characteristics, milk production and husbandry. |
| 15 points | Possible for DISPLAY. Posters, pictures, charts, articles, clippings or by any method of educating the public in a pleasing manner. |
| 10 points* | Possible for ENTHUSIASM or ATTITUDE, which will include enjoyment of the project and love of Dairy Goats. |
| 5 points | Possible for SHOWMANSHIP, based on placing of that individual in whatever level he or she enters; 5 points for first place, 4 for second, and so on. |
| 5 points | Possible for CLASS PLACING: 5 points for first place, 4 for second and so on. The average of the youngster's animals' placing will be used to achieve the owner's score. (group placing, championships, etc. not counted) |

* These categories to be scored after talking to ALL contestants.

WINNERS IN THE ABOVE AREAS WILL BE DETERMINED IN THREE CATEGORIES OF SCOPE:

Youngsters owning less than five animals; those with five to ten animals; those with more than ten. This is done so that the handicap of caring for different size herds can be overcome.

From the three semi-finalists, juniors who wish to be considered for the award must be available for interviews after the Junior Show. The interview will cover: Individual goals; size and scope of project; knowledge of costs and income for the project; prior awards or recognition; participation in the decision of the project (the why, how, where and when); history of his or her project; any failures or mistakes?
