

FFA and 4-H SHOWMANSHIP DEPARTMENT 270

DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND INFORMATION

1. Showmanship contests are open to all exhibitors entered in FFA and 4-H livestock division classes. Entry **MUST BE INCLUDED** on Market or Breeding animal Entry Forms.
2. Animals shown in showmanship classes must be owned, fitted and shown by the exhibitor in Junior Division Market or Breeding Livestock classes. Animals may not be brought to the fairgrounds specifically for showmanship classes.
3. If a single exhibitor enters both market and breeding animals in the same species, the market animal must be used for showmanship. If exhibitor only enters breeding animals, exhibitor may use breeding animal for showmanship class.
4. All contestants are required to wear the official 4-H Club uniform or FFA uniform for Showmanship Contests.
5. Independent Junior exhibitors will dress in a like manner of FFA/4-H exhibitors.
6. Independent Junior exhibitors 12 years of age or older who have never shown that particular type of animal before will compete in Junior Showmanship classes where provided or Senior Showmanship where no Junior Showmanship classes are provided.
7. **AGES REQUIRED FOR SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES ARE THE EXHIBITOR'S AGE ON THE DATE OF THE SHOWMANSHIP CLASS.**
8. American System of Judging.
9. No unaltered male livestock will be permitted in any Showmanship Class.
10. Entry Fee: \$3.00

JUDGING: Showmanship classes may be prior to or after the market classes at the discretion of the judge and/or show chair.

CLASSES may be divided by the judge for convenience in judging.

The top three showmen in each class may show in the final round of the next higher class of that species at this Fair, if the judge allows. This shall have no bearing on the Showmanship status of these showmen in subsequent years at this Fair. All showmen shall start in the appropriate class for their age (as of the show date) for each year's Fair.

AWARDS: Ribbons for First through Eighth Place shall be awarded in Beginning, Novice and Junior Showmanship Classes.

1. No entry fee.
2. Entry is voluntary – no substitutions.
3. All other showmanship rules will apply.
4. Jacket will be awarded to overall winners in each species.

DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND INFORMATION

1. Contestant is to have won the showmanship contest in the species of beef, dairy cattle, sheep, swine, market goat, dairy goat, horses, rabbits or poultry. Participants in Round Robin Showmanship must be residents of Santa Cruz, Monterey, San Benito or Santa Clara Counties.
2. Species to be shown are beef, dairy cattle, sheep, swine, market goats and dairy goats. Horses and rabbits will not be shown in Round Robin.
3. Competition will be completed when each contestant has shown all species. Final results will be based on a total point system. Tie breaker question(s) will break a tie.
4. All exhibitors must wear boots.
5. All participants must provide their own equipment, e.g. cane, show stick, etc.
6. Contestants will be disqualified if they are getting coached during a competition. Once judging has begun, no talking to contestants will be allowed. This rule will be strictly enforced.
7. **All Showmanship first place winners in each species, 4-H Junior and Senior, and FFA Novice and Senior, will be required to sign in at the Livestock Office by 8:00 PM on the day following their species show day to sign up for Round Robin.** After 8:00 PM, or if the first place finisher declines or is ineligible, the slot will be filled by second place winners through 8th place sequentially, and be contacted by the Round Robin Coordinator.

DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND INFORMATION

1. Livestock educational displays provide individuals and clubs/chapters an opportunity to acquaint the public with information about beef, sheep, swine, goats (dairy, market, breeding), dairy cattle, rabbits, sheep, swine and poultry. Content for entries in miscellaneous class will pertain to areas of livestock animal science or husbandry not represented by another class.
2. These are to be individual or club/chapter exhibits and are not part of a Club or Chapter Clean Pen display. The Committee will display exhibits.
3. All entries in this division must have been produced within one year of the opening of the Fair. **Entries may not have been previously exhibited at the Santa Cruz County Fair.**
4. Entries limited to 1 per individual, 4-H Club or FFA Chapter per species. An individual participating in 4-H Club or FFA Chapter entry may also enter an individual exhibit.
5. Displays must be designed and constructed by organization members. Instructors or leaders may supervise only. Instructors or leaders must sign entry forms as agent for Clubs or Chapters.
6. Exhibits may consist of signs, mechanical displays or interactive boards.
7. Signs are not to be larger than 4'x4', with information on one side. **All signs must be laminated or otherwise weather proofed as display may be shown outside for the duration of the Fair.**
8. All combustible materials must be fire retardant. All exhibits must meet safety requirements.
9. Three-dimensional displays will be allowed provided they are free standing, no more than 40 lbs, weather resistant, do not exceed 4'X4'X4' and can be safely displayed to the public. Any displays that do not meet these standards may be disqualified at the discretion of the department head.
10. 4-H or FFA entries may place club/chapter name along bottom of exhibit. Letters should be no taller than 3 inches. Individual entries may have name and age in the lower right hand corner. Maximum space for name and age to be 4"x6".
11. Judges shall insist upon a high quality of products and materials used in the exhibits.
12. Use MARKET entry form.

HERDSMANSHIP CONTEST DEPARTMENT 267 Junior Livestock Committee

The Herdsmanship Contest will recognize club and chapter livestock exhibits that ensure the well-being of the animals, are neat and attractive, provide information that is interesting or educational about the species, and promote FFA and 4-H programs to the public.

All clubs/chapters will be entered in the contest and will be judged according to the scorecard below. Independent exhibitor groups will be judged with 4-H clubs.

All exhibits will be inspected daily during the Fair.

Daily total points will be posted outside Livestock Office; daily winners in each species will receive ribbons. Overall winners for each species will be awarded prizes at the Awards Ceremony on Sunday, September 19, 2010. In the event of a tie for overall species winners, Sunday's score will serve as a tiebreaker. Species winners must turn in thank you letters by 2 p.m. on Sunday or forfeit the award to the runners-up.

Herdsmanship duties are the responsibility of exhibitors rather than leaders and parents. Leaders and parents may supervise and provide minimal assistance in the interest of safety from outside of pens and stalls, but exhibitors are encouraged to do

duties they are capable of doing. Points will not be awarded if the parents/leaders perform the work.

Area of responsibility will extend to all alleys surrounding each exhibit.

Pens will be inspected after 8AM and 5PM, Tuesday through Saturday, and after 8AM on Sunday.

OPEN LIVESTOCK JUDGING CONTEST DEPARTMENT 268 Shary Greene

Friday, September 17, 2010 6:00 PM.

REGISTRATION: 5:00 – 5:30 PM.

Open to everyone. Places of contest will be posted in Livestock Office. Team members must be from one club or chapter and adult leaders must be from one club or chapter.

1. Any individual may enter. Does not have to be a member of any club or chapter. (Boy or girl must be under 18 years of age.)
2. The three top individuals of 4-H Clubs, 4-H Leaders, FFA Chapters, or FFA Advisors from one (1) club / chapter may compete for the team award.
3. Any contestant, who confers with another individual without authorization, while the contest is in progress, shall be immediately barred from the contest by the individual in charge.
4. All contestants will be graded as follows: Correct placing will be 50 points in each class.
5. If the highest-ranking teams in judging of stock are tied in total points the team, so tied with the highest-ranking contestants in judging all divisions shall be designated as the winning team of the contest. If the highest ranking individuals of the highest ranking teams are tied, the teams so tied that has the next highest ranking individuals shall be designated as the winning team, and so on until the tie is broken. The same system shall be applied to teams that may be tied in judging the different kinds of livestock by ascertaining the team that has the highest-ranking individuals. Individual competition ties to be broken by a weight-guessing contest.
